# Crescent Heights High School



# Prairie Rose Syrian Refugee Project

Please join us for our event series focusing on Syrian culture. This series will help us in preparation for the arrival of our Syrian refugee family. Come and discover culture through language learning, prose, music, shopping, and of course, food. Our first presentation is called "Stripped to the Bone: stories of Syrian Women". Ghada Al Atrash will be reading from her book Stripped to the Bone, to music. The Syrian Women's Club of Calgary will be attending this event to answer questions and mingle. It will be held at Wild Rose on Wednesday Sept. 14, 2016 at 7:00 pm in Centennial Hall.

## October 5 Greensleeves Program

Getting older often brings us to consider what we would like to happen as we near the end of our lives. The Greensleeves Program provides a way to keep health and end-of-life information in one place, a green sleeve which will travel with you to doctors' appointments or to hospital. Alexandra Kushliak, Education consultant with Alberta Health Services, will lead the evening.

## October 12 Companioning Those Who Grieve & Mourn

There are many times in our lives when we experience loss, and with those around us need to find our way through the sorrow. Geoffrey Simmins will facilitate a workshop using Dr. Alan Wolfelt's theories of grief and mourning to help us distinguish between grief and mourning, and to discuss ways to companion those who are grieving and mourning losses in their lives.

# October 19 Loss of Hearing

As we age, our hearing often changes and diminishes, and it can be difficult to know how to cope. A facilitator from Sound Advice with Deaf and Hear Alberta will come to discuss these changes, ways to protect our ears against hearing loss, and ways to cope with less than acute hearing.

### October 26 Sandwich Generation

As parents live longer, families with children often find themselves trying to care not only for their children, but also for their aging parents. Charlene Retzlaff, a social worker with the Family Caregiver Centre, will facilitate a session suggesting ways to cope, and to care for ourselves as we care for both our parents and our children.

## Finger Labyrinth Workshop

Saturday, November 26, 1:00 – 4:00 pm

The labyrinth is often used as a tool to facilitate meditation, peacefulness, problem-solving, and others. It is not always possible to go to a labyrinth to walk; a finger labyrinth is always available whenever you want it. Alison Morrow will facilitate a half-day workshop where each participant will make their own lightweight labyrinth. All supplies will be provided, and there will be a fee for this workshop, to be decided when the cost of materials is determined.




help people become more familiar with it. If you ever have picked up the Bible and wondered whether it makes a better doorstop than reading material, this program is for you!

# Conversations that Matter: Exploring My Faith with Others November 2,9 and 16 (series with three parts)



# Finance Committee Update

### **Progressive Fundraising – Shopping Cards**

It has been almost two years since we introduced the shopping card program where the Church receives a percentage of the price of the cards but the church members get to spend the full value of the card. It is important to realize that you do not have to spend the entire value of the card in one transaction. A balance remaining shows on the receipt from the business and that amount remains on the card for future transactions. If you place a small sticker on the card you can record remaining balances so that you are prepared for future transactions.

There are over 70 stores that offer cards that we can purchase. All the major food stores are on the shopping card order form except for Co-op.

The church buys Co-op cards in bulk directly from Co-op because that gives us the maximum discount that is offered of 9%. Those cards are available for purchase each Sunday after the service and from the office during the week. All the other cards need to be ordered from Vancouver and are available the week following submission of the order. Those cards can either be paid for when the order is placed or when the cards are actually received.

Only a small percentage of our membership are taking advantage of cards for grocery shopping. We would like to increase these numbers. There are over 140 individuals supporting the church through regular offerings. Imagine the benefit to the church if each of those individuals bought enough cards to cover their grocery bill each month. If half bought Co-op cards and the other half bought cards for other grocery stores the church would realize over \$2,500 a month if the average purchase was \$300 for groceries. If the church supporter bought an additional \$50 card for one of the other stores the church would receive over \$200 a month if only cards with a 3% discount were purchased. As several of the cards offer higher discounts the church would receive a larger amount. Currently we struggle each month to get \$2,000 in orders and when you deduct the shipping fee to get the cards from Vancouver, the card program only produces about \$45 for the church. The Co-op program produces about \$900 every six to eight weeks.

Remember that you can use your credit card to buy gift cards. Payment has to be made through PayPal at the office. A receipt will be issued that you present to the card desk for cards ordered.
